Japan Handover Medical Equipment to Al Farouq Society for Orphans Care

The handover ceremony of medical equipment was held at the clinic of Al Farouq Society for Orphans Care in Palestinian Camp, Irbid on Wednesday July 17th 2019. The 4D ultrasound equipment and bone densitometer were handed over from Mr. Masahiro Tada, Deputy Chief of Mission of Japan to the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan to Mr. Husein Fayez Husein Abu Dubai, President of Al Farouq Society for Orphans Care.

In 2018, the Government of Japan extended to the Society a grant in total of five thousand six hundred and thirty five US dollars (USD 50,635) for the implementation of the project titled "Provision of Medical Equipment to Clinic in Irbid Palestinian Refugee Camp" through the Japanese Grant Assistance for Grass-Roots Human Security Projects called GGP which aims to improve basic human needs at the grass-roots level through NGOs and local governments.

The overall objective of the project is to improve the quality of medical services provided at Al Farouq Society for Orphan's Care's medical center by enabling advanced and accurate gynecological examination including the diagnosis of fetal disorders and early detection of osteoporosis, through the provision of 4D ultrasound equipment and bone densitometer. The Society was established in 1991 as an NGO and has been supporting orphans and other vulnerable people including refugees by providing medical services with affordable price, in addition to extending various kinds of supports such as providing educational opportunities and accommodations. With the new medical equipment provided by Japan, more accurate and immediate diagnosis by the doctors and the required treatment afterwards will be available at their clinic in Palestinian Refugee camp in Irbid.

In the speech delivered during the handover ceremony Mr. Tada emphasized the importance of the project and stated: "We sincerely hope that the medical equipment provided by Japanese grant will be effectively and continuously utilized by the Society and contribute to provide the needed medical care for all mothers and refugees regardless of their social background in Irbid."

Under Japanese Grant Assistance for Grass-Roots Human Security Projects, Japan has extended more than 10 million US dollars for 147 projects to NGOs, schools, hospitals, and local governments in Jordan since 1993.
